Announcement that War Assets Administration in Washington has authorized transfer of a portion of Fort McIntosh to the Laredo Junior College District for a nominal consideration means that Laredo will soon have one of the outstanding junior colleges in the nation, J. C. Martin, President of the Board of Trustees of Laredo Junior College District, stated Saturday.

The announcement means that the Laredo Municipal Junior College will open in September at Fort McIntosh. The Board of Trustees has been working a long time to acquire a large portion of Fort McIntosh as the site for the new Laredo Municipal Junior College. An application was filed a number of months ago with the Federal Public Housing Authority in Washington.

World Diplomats Converge On City For Historic Meet

MOSCOW, March 8.—(UP)—Foreign Secretary Ernest Bevin arrived in Moscow for the Big Four Conference and issued an immediate appeal that the foreign ministers make a sound peace "that will let the whole world live in security."

Bevin was met on his arrival by a special train at the Bykov-Russia station by Vice Ministers of Foreign Affairs Andrei V. Vishinsky with a welcome which was notable for its contrast with the usual panoply of a Soviet greeting.

Foreign Minister V. M. Molotov who customarily welcomes important personages was absent. The bands which customarily play the national anthems of the visiting countries were absent. No formal guard of honor was on hand.

The lack of formal ceremonies caused immediate comment, particularly since the Soviet had turned out all these honors only last week for the visit of the Polish Premier Josef Cyrankiewicz.
